CIVIL COMMITMENT UNDER W&I CODE 6600

- 1. Has been convicted of a sexually violent offense against two or more victims;**
- 2. Has a current diagnosed mental disorder which makes him a danger to the health and safety of others; and**
- 3. This current mental disorder makes him a danger to the health and safety of others in that it is likely that he will engage in sexually violent predatory behavior without the appropriate treatment and custody.**

**** Danger to the health and safety of others: Does not require proof of a recent overt act while the offender is in custody**

**** “Likely” to engage in sexually violent criminal behavior: because of current mental disorder, respondent presents a substantial danger—a serious and well-founded risk, that he will commit such crimes if released.**

**** “Predatory” behavior: An act directed toward a stranger, a person of casual acquaintance with whom no substantial relationship exists, or individual with whom relationship established or promoted for primary purpose of victimization.**

**** Need much more than mere possibility**

**** Risk doesn't have to be more than 50%**
